About the Legal Aid Justice Center

The Legal Aid Justice Center is a nationally recognized nonprofit organization that partners with communities and clients to achieve justice by dismantling the systems that create and perpetuate poverty. Justice means racial justice, economic justice, and social justice. From its offices in Charlottesville, Richmond, Petersburg, and Falls Church, LAJC is a fierce advocate for low-income clients and communities in Virginia. Just in the past year, we permanently repealed Virginia's driver's license suspension for court debt scheme, secured an injunction slashing the number of immigrants detained by ICE at the largest detention center in the Mid-Atlantic and passed a law giving Virginia oversight authority, won the nation's first COVID-specific, statewide, and enforceable workplace safety standards, and decriminalized school-based disorderly conduct, which was a leading contributor to the school-to-prison pipeline, especially for Black girls.

Founded in 1967, LAJC provides services under four key program areas: Civil Rights & Racial Justice, Economic Justice, Youth Justice, and Immigrant Advocacy. LAJC boldly tackles issues of systemic injustice and aims to raise public and policymaker awareness of some of the most pressing challenges facing low-income Virginia residents. About the Position

Legal Aid Justice Center seeks a full-time team player willing to join our housing team and begin helping tenants in the pandemic Rent Relief Program. Job duties include answering questions and enrolling eligible people in the Rent Relief Program, advocating for tenants with their landlords and the state Housing department, and connecting tenants with other resources as needed. This position in our Falls Church office, which interacts with a largely Spanish-speaking immigrant population. We expect the position to entail a significant outreach and education component to inform local communities regarding available assistance and assisting individuals in accessing and retaining benefits to which they are entitled. All LAJC positions will work remotely through at least July 31, 2021, but a small amount of in-person work (with appropriate health precautions) will be necessary in order to collect and scan documents.

Job Duties

- Engaging in outreach and education around rental assistance, renter's rights, and other benefits or assistance for folks experiencing economic hardship
- Enrolling eligible individuals in rent relief
- Working with our team of attorneys and organizers to build strength, support, and trust in local client communities

Required Qualifications

- Strong commitment to social, economic, and racial justice
- A high level of professionalism and outstanding interpersonal communication skills

- Tenacity and attention to detail
- Ability to work effectively both independently and collaboratively
- Access to reliable transportation
- Fluency in Spanish

Preferred Qualifications

- Demonstrated experience working with individuals and/or communities directly impacted by economic and racial injustice
- Demonstrated experience helping others navigate government services: filling out forms, educating on rights, etc.
- Economic, social, and/or cultural experiences relevant to the populations most directly impacted by poverty

Location

This role is based in our Falls Church office. Occasional travel between offices will be required.
