The Strategy:

To equip gatekeepers and stewards of youth with information and resources to empower young people to assert their rights during interactions with law enforcement.

FAQ

Q: How much does it cost to purchase the wristbands and notecards?

A: We use MSP Design Group for wristband printing and distribution. The total cost is approximately \$180 for 300 1/2" debossed ink filled wristbands. The notecards are ordered through Overnight Prints and cost approximately \$50 for 500.

Q: How do I bring Our Rights Matter to my school, youth group, community organization, athletic team, neighborhood, shelter, or program?
