Eligibility: To qualify for the program, the applicant must:

Be a Richmond City resident. Have been issued a Summons for Unlawful Detainer.

Not exceed gross household income of 80% area median income. Pay at least 10% of amount owed as of the first court date. Come to court on the court date. Be able to pay ongoing rent on the due date. Have rent arrears as the only issue.

Not have participated in an eviction diversion program within the last 12 months.

Not have rental payments exceed \$2,000.
